Target Population	Likely presidential primary voters; Republican; Florida; CNN debate watchers (subset)
Sampling Method	Landline: Registered Florida voters were selected randomly and surveyed on the evening of December 16th, 2015 on their landline telephone using an interactive voice response system.
	Mobile: Registered Florida voters unable to be reached by landline were surveyed using their mobile device on December 16th, 2015.
Weighting	Only respondents determined likely to vote in the 2016 Republican presidential primary were included in the survey.
	The poll was weighted for age, race, and gender using propensity scores, according to presidential primary turnout figures and internal projections.
Total Number of Respondents	555 (weighted)
Margin of Error	±4.1% (95% confidence)
