Sampling Method	Landline: Registered Georgia voters were selected randomly and surveyed on the evening of December 16 <sup>th</sup> , 2015 on their landline telephone using an interactive voice response system.
	Mobile: Registered Georgia voters unable to be reached by landline were surveyed using their mobile device on December 16 <sup>th</sup> , 2015.
Weighting	Only respondents determined likely to vote in the 2016 Republican presidential primary were included in the survey.
	The poll was weighted for age, race, and gender using propensity scores, according to presidential primary turnout figures and internal projections.
