Target Population Likely 2016 General election voters; Georgia

Sampling Method Blended sample; mixed mode:

Likely voters were selected from a list of registered Georgia voters. Only voters determined likely to vote in the 2016 general election were included in the sample.

Landline: registered voters were contacted on the evening of August 17th, 2016 using an interactive voice response system.

Mobile: registered voters were contacted on the evening of August 17th, 2016 on their mobile devices. Respondents answered an identical

survey in visual form.

Weighting The survey was weighted for age, race, gender,

party affiliation, and region using propensity scores. Weighting benchmarks were determined

using historical turnout data and internal

projections.

Total Number of Respondents 730

Margin of Error ±3.6% (95% confidence)
